6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The syllabus is reviewed and revised every three years. The major restructuring is done periodically after taking into consideration the feedback from all the stakeholders such as alumni, employers, industry and academic experts from educational institutions. The College follows the guidelines for curriculum development and restructuring set down by the UGC and the University of Bharadidasan.
- The system of formal Feedback from students also ensures the Curriculum Development
- Faculty members participate in syllabi framing committees

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- After the completion of topics/units, in order to improve the results, regular Unit Tests are conducted.
- Extra classes are arranged departmentally for smooth completion of the syllabus.

6.3.4 Research and Development

For the last 5 years the college has an active research committee. This committee endeavours to encourage the active participation of the desiring research scholars and with full co-operation from the teachers and support from the active Research committee, this committee has been successful from the very date of its inception. The research committee comprises of the Principal and faculty members of the college.

- The Institution motivates teachers to take up both Major and Minor Research Projects and publication in refereed journals.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

LIBRARY: There is a collection of around 58,000 (fifty eight thousand) copies of text books, reference books and journals covering a wide range of subjects in the College library. Besides, magazines and newspapers are subscribed regularly. In the Reading Room, attached to the library, reference books, journals, magazines and newspapers are placed for consultation . Every department has a Departmental Library where useful reference books are available for the reference of faculty and students

ICT : Every department is attached with audio visual facility, which is connected with the Principal. All the departments had the access of Wifi and BSNL connection. Moreover all the departments has been attached with LCD projector, Xerox machine and Laser and Inkjet printers

Physical Infrastructure : The total built up area has been extended to Sq feet with an increase of additional classrooms of 32.
